Strathmore Drawing Pad, 9x12"	Any sketchbook or drawing paper	Week 1
Kimberly Drawing Graphite Pencils, 2H and 2B	Any pencils, having hard (2H) and soft (2B) are great	Week 1
White Steadler Eraser	White rubber eraser, pencil eraser, or kneaded eraser	Week 1
Speedball Soft Rubber Pop-In Brayer, 4 in.	Any brayer to roll thin layers of printmaking ink	Week 3
Speedball Water-based Printmaking Inks: Black Ink, 2.5 oz Red Ink, 2.5 oz Blue Ink, 2.5 oz Yellow Ink, 2.5 oz White Ink, 2.5 oz	Any water-based or soy-based printmaking ink. If you already happen to have oil-based ink at home, that's ok too, but I wouldn't recommend purchasing it for at-home use as clean-up is more challenging	Black ink: Week 3 Colored Ink: Week 5
Brushes for watercolor and monotype: Royal Clear Choice Round Brush, Size 1 Royal Clear Choice Flat Brush, ½ in. Royal Clear Choice Flat Brush, 1 in. Princeton SNAP Round brush, Size 6	A variety of preferably synthetic brushes including one medium-size round for watercolor, medium-size flat brush for monotype, and a detail brush	Week 4
Impress Monoprint Plate, 1 plate size 8 x 10	Any plexiglass plate/ acrylic sheet DIY printmaking plates: Sheet of Yupo, Mylar, Duralar, or Acetate A mirror or other flat, slippery surface A glass or plexiglass sheet, like one from inside a picture frame	Week 4
Strathmore Printmaking Paper Pad, 11 x 14in.	Any printmaking paper. Big sheets that can be torn down into smaller sizes also work great. Last resort: drawing paper	Week 4
Strathmore Watercolor Pad, 9x12", 140 lb., 12 sheets, cold press	Any watercolor paper, 140 lb works great for lots of layering	Week 5
Talens Watercolor Set	Any watercolor paints, in tubes or pans Minimum colors: Red, Yellow, and Blue	Week 5
10-well Round Plastic Palette, with wells for watercolor	4-5 small plastic cups and a plastic plate to mix watercolor in/on	Week 5
Assorted Origami Paper	Colored printer paper, newspapers, magazines, decorative/scrapbooking paper, catalogs/advertisements from the mail, drawing paper painted with watercolor, colored with markers, crayons, or colored pencils, or rolled with different colored inks	Week 7
Glue Stick	Elmers glue, PVA size, any glue sticks, matte medium, Nori Paste, Wood Glue, Spray Adhesive, etc.	Week 7
