

**Project #3 – Psychology & Sociology**  
**Character Cereal Boxes**  
**Psychological Disorders**

**What to do:**

1. Choose a fictional character: TV, Film, Literature, Gaming etc.
2. Get an empty cereal box
  - a. The front of the cereal box should have the following:
    - i. Name of your chosen character
    - ii. Name for their brand of cereal (should be related to their psychological disorder)
    - iii. A slogan for this brand of cereal
  - b. The side panels of the cereal box should have the following:
    - i. A break down of the characters personality traits (like the ingredients that are found in your cereals)
    - ii. A diagnosis of possible disorders that your character may suffer from and why they may suffer from them (use examples of things that the character has done in their roles)
  - c. The back of the cereal box should have the following:
    - i. This part of the project should be like most cereal boxes and have some sort of game or activity that is related to your character and their story.

## DISORDERS

### Possible Disorders
