

# 38-Election Day

## *Polling Places*

Polling Places-located in individual **precincts**  
Usually in schools, town halls, fire department, other public places  
Open early and close late to allow more people to vote (6:30 AM-7:30 PM)

## *General Elections*

Elections are controlled by the local Board of Elections  
General Election is held on the 1st Tuesday in November after the 1st Monday  
**Plurality**-winning the most votes of anyone (usually that is enough to win)  
**Majority**-winning more than half the votes  
Presidential election requires a majority of electoral votes

## *Direct Democracy to Vote on Laws in NC*

**Initiatives**-method where citizens propose a bill through a petition and place it on the ballot for a vote during a general election

**Referendums**-method where a bill passed by the General Assembly is put up for a vote of approval (or disapproval) by the people of North Carolina during the general election

## *Casting Your Vote*

Go to polling place for your precinct  
Check to see if you are on list of registered voters

Cast vote (usually done by touch screen)

**Exit poll**-media asks who you voted for after you've voted, you don't have to answer, used to predict winners

## *Types of Votes*

**Straight ticket**-when a voter votes for only one political party on a ballot

**Split ticket**-when a voter votes for candidates from different parties on a ballot

**Absentee ballot**-a ballot filled out by someone who is unable to make it to the polling place (ex. A deployed U.S. marine)

**Early voting**-voting that is allowed before election day

## *Special Kinds of Elections*

**Recounts**-when the election is so close that the losing candidate calls for the votes to be counted again to check for any errors

**Runoffs**-when more than two candidates are involved and no candidate receives a majority of the votes, some states hold runoff elections between the top two vote-getters

**Recalls**-a special election to vote an official who is performing very poorly is voted out of office
