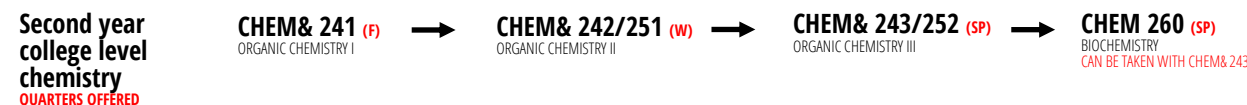

Pre-college level chemistry courses *1 year of high school chemistry may provide placement in CHEM& 161 - see a chemistry advisor*

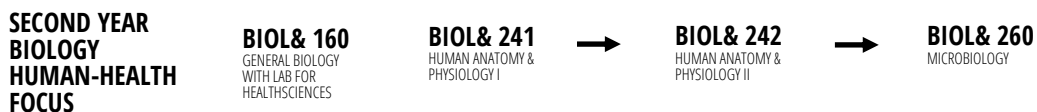

This handout is based on a student earning an Associate of Arts—Direct Transfer (AA-DTA) degree. Here is a brief explanation of the degree and why our advisors recommend it.



Student completes 90 credits for the AA-DTA degree. Most credits are part of the student's general education requirements. Credits transfer to a university.



At the university the student is considered a junior for most science and/or math classes. Additional major specific courses are required during the junior and senior year.
