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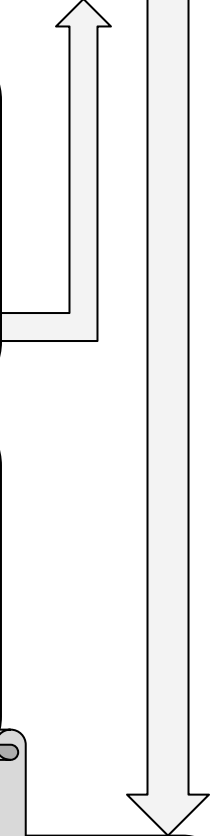
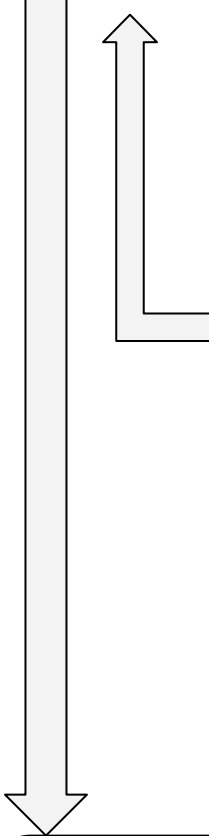
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If somehow the bill has survived all of this. It is now sent to the desk of the President who can...

1. **VETO** IT ONE OF TWO WAYS (VETO-THE PRESIDENTIAL POWER TO KILL A BILL BEFORE IT BECOMES A LAW)
  - A. REGULAR VETO-A FORMAL REJECTION OF THE BILL
  - B. POCKET VETO-NOT SIGNING A BILL WHEN CONGRESS HAS ADJOURNED (KILLS THE BILL)

Or the president can...

2. Make the bill into law one of two ways\*\*\*
  - a. Sign the bill into law
  - b. Not sign it but set it aside for ten days while Congress is in session, the bill becomes a law without official presidential approval (why might the President prefer this way sometimes?)



**BILL BECOMES A LAW!**

Overriding a Presidential Veto (if necessary)  
Congress can override a veto with a  $\frac{2}{3}$  vote  
This is VERY difficult to achieve

When the veto is overridden the bill becomes a law the same as if the President had signed it\*\*\*
